



Dr Miguel Paredes Maldonado

Dr Miguel Paredes Maldonado is the Head of the Edinburgh School of Architecture and Landscape Architecture (ESALA), The University of Edinburgh.

He is also a Senior Lecturer in Architectural Design, a Chartered Architect and a Partner in award-winning research and design studio Cuartoymitad Architecture & Landscape.

Miguel's research and scholarship are articulated through writing, speculative design and architectural practice. His work has been published and exhibited internationally, most notably at the 11th and 16th editions of the Venice Biennale.

Miguel's architectural output include the conversion of an eighteenth-century fortress in Santoña (Spain) into the Monte Buciero Museum (Próxima-Arquia award 2014), the spatial design and ephemeral architecture for the Zinc Shower event in Madrid (COAM award 2014 and Próxima-Arquia award 2014), and the development of a scalable residential neighbourhood in the Faroe Islands (Finalist, Nordic Built Cities competition 2016)
